
EASTER EGG 2020

EASTER EGG 2020

In this time of self- or compulsory isolation, I propose *Easter Egg* as an alternative to the never-ending litany of bad news on television and in the press - and also as thanks to all those, wherever they are, who have stayed in touch and shared their experiences: from a retirement community in Palo Alto, a mountain hideaway, a student hostel in London, or from the other side of the street - together with my family, and colleagues from work, tennis and golf. I am forcibly reminded of Giovanni Boccaccio's *Decameron*, a book containing 100 tales told by a group of seven young women and three young men sheltering in a secluded villa just outside Florence to escape the Black Death, that was raging in the city. Boccaccio wrote the *Decameron* after the epidemic of 1348. It had a major influence on Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales*.

I fear our confinement is likely to last much longer than the ten days that make up the Decameron, so please heed my advice for tasting my *Christmas Pudding* "It is still good a long time after the first serving and is not heavy if enjoyed sparingly." 

Subway map for staying at home (Matt, Daily Telegraph)


