June and Moon are, of course, among poets' and songwriters' favourite words - not only are they evocative, but, more importantly, there are 93 other words that rhyme with them. Gus Edwards and Edward Madden were well aware of this when, in 1909, they wrote the song *By the light of the silvery moon*, made famous by Billy Murray and Ada Jones, among the most popular singers in the USA at the time, and later by Doris Day and others:

By the light of the silvery moon I want to spoon, To my honey I'll croon love's tune. Honey moon, keep a-shinin' in June Your silvery beams will bring love's dreams We'll be cuddlin' soon ... etc. etc. etc.

By 1925, performers were beginning to tire of its marshmallow lyrics. In 1923, Murray recorded a parody:

Oh, I'm sick of all these ditties about "moon" and "spoon" and "June" So, will you stand up, and sing for your father an old time tune!

Murray had already recorded a 'moon' song in 1909, also with Ada Jones: *Shine on Harvest Moon.* Too many moons can make you a loon.

On a more serious note, a poem by the American poet Carl Sandberg (1878-1967)

Moonset

Leaves of poplars pick Japanese prints against the west. Moon sand on the canal doubles the changing pictures. The moon's good-by ends pictures. The west is empty. All else is empty. No moon-talk at all now. Only dark listening to dark.

And of course, Shakespeare from *The Merchant of Venice*. "The moon shines bright; in such a night as this, when the sweet wind did gently kiss the trees and they did make no noise, in such a night"

So in case you are feeling increasingly lunatic in these loony times, here is another compendium to make you at least smile, if not actually LOL.
